

I started running agility in January 1989 with the family's Shetland Sheepdog. In the summer of 1990, I got my first Border Collie, which always has been my breed. Røde or Rykki as I called him was only the 2nd agility Border collie in Denmark. 👍

In 1993 we won the European Championship and in 1998 we came 4th at the World Championship. For 12 years in total, I have been on the Danish national team with 3 of my dogs, where we have contributed to winning both silver and bronze for the team. In total with my 5 dogs over time, it has also become three Nordic Championships and a silver medal as well as a total of 5 Danish Championships. 😊

In the context of the European Open, I participated for the first time in 2003 and I have participated in a total of 14 EOs, where I have been in the final several times with all my 3 participating dogs. At the latest in 2017, Zepto finished as no. 13. Not the fastest, but he had a clear run. 😊

In 1995 I was authorized as an agility judge. Both as a participant and a judge, I like technical challenges that can be solved in several different ways, where the equipment can choose the solution that they have trained best for and can gain time on the competitors. I have always valued agility as an activity/sport for all teams, regardless of breed and handler's age, physical ability and level.

Today my two Border collies are; Zepto, 10½ years old, who has just stopped senior training and competitions and is instead having fun with Hoopers. Pixel, 6 years old is competing in class 3.
